John F. Kennedy Library and Museum, Boston, Massachusetts

Situated on a ten-acre park overlooking Boston Harbor, the John F. Kennedy Library and Museum is the nation's official memorial to John F. Kennedy, 35th President of the United States. The Museum at the Kennedy Library enables visitors to step back into the recreated world of the early 1960's and experience first hand the life and legacy of John F. Kennedy. In 25 dramatic exhibits, including three theaters and 20 video presentations, visitors are inspired by the stirring eloquence of John F. Kennedy and by the grace of Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy. The Museum's period settings include rare film and television footage, historic Presidential documents, personal family keepsakes, treasures from the White House, and gifts from throughout the world. From I.M. Pei's magnificent architectural achievement, guests enjoy spectacular panoramic views of Boston Harbor and the city's skyline. The Kennedy Library is the only presidential library in New England and one of ten in the United States.

Battleship Cove, Fall River, Massachusetts

Located on Fall River's vibrant waterfront, Battleship Cove is a maritime heritage museum preserving the world's largest collection of historic naval ships. As a permanent fixture in Southeastern New England since 1965, Battleship Cove encompasses five National Historic Landmarks, the highest concentration south of Boston's Freedom Trail, and is Massachusetts' official memorial for Bay Staters killed in 9/11, WWII and the Korean, Vietnam, and Persian Gulf Wars. Visit Battleship Massachusetts; Submarine Lionfish; Destroyer Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr., famous for its role in the Cuban Missile Crisis; PT 617 & 796, the only pair of fully restored PT Boats on display in the world; and the Soviet-built Missile Corvette Hiddensee. Honor the Kennedy family's naval legacy by exploring PT 796, used in President John F. Kennedy's 1960 inauguration parade and learn more about Robert F. Kennedy's service on board the Destroyer Kennedy. See new, dynamic exhibits, pay a visit to the fully restored Fall River Carousel, and enjoy a festival of activities for the entire family!
